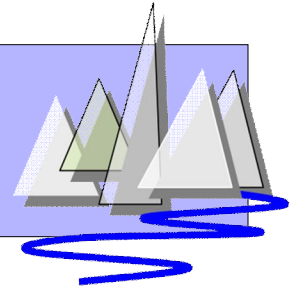

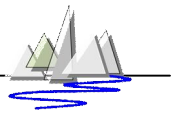

Letter to District 6 presented by The Great News Group as follows:

Open letter to District 6 Area 18 Pacific Region of Alcoholics Anonymous

We are writing this letter with concern due to practices we see in some local Alcoholics Anonymous groups of having non-alcoholics join their A.A. group, take group service commitments and chair A.A. meetings. We believe that this is detrimental to the individual A.A. group, the non-alcoholic who is led to believe that they are an A.A. member, and to the other local groups. Historically in A.A., these practices have been tried and found to be detrimental to the recovery of alcoholics. We would like to have this brought to the District 6 meeting as a point of discussion. We feel that it would be beneficial to the alcoholic group members and to A.A. as a whole in our area if the individual groups would take up an educated discussion about A.A. membership principles and practices. This same discussion within our group has been beneficial and informative, and we feel other groups could benefit as well.

It is not our intent to offend anyone, and we apologize in advance to anyone who takes offense or misunderstands our intent. In no way do we wish to dictate to other groups how their groups should function. Our intent is simply to raise this issue out of concern for the welfare of A.A. and the best interests of its present and future members in this area.

*Bill W. wrote often on the usefulness of singleness of purpose of Alcoholics Anonymous. "Sobriety – freedom from alcohol – through the teaching and practice of the Twelve Steps is the sole purpose of an A.A. group. Groups have repeatedly tried other activities, and they have always failed. It has also been learned that **there is no possible way to make non-alcoholics into A.A. members.** We have to confine our membership to alcoholics, and we have to confine our A.A. groups to a single purpose. If we don't stick to these principles, we shall almost surely collapse. And if we collapse, we cannot help anyone."*(page 223 *The Language Of The Heart*; page 4 pamphlet *Problems Other Than Alcohol*)

We believe that the reason Bill W and our cofounders wrote on the singleness of purpose so much is due to the importance of A.A. being united around this principle. In the early days of A.A. it was also thought that the A.A. message could be carried wholesale to address a host of other problems and conditions. It was soon learned that an A.A. group trying to be all things to all people simply did not work. If an A.A. group does these things, the group risks the following real dangers, which in the early days led directly to the formulation of our Fifth Tradition. First and foremost, a newcomer bearing a non-alcoholic at an A.A. meeting may not relate to the message of the non-alcoholic and may leave A.A. forever, convinced that it has nothing to offer him or her. Second, the failures caused by this practice may harm other groups and A.A. as a whole, as word of these practices and the negative results they produce spreads.

"Each group has but one primary purpose - to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers."

"The very life of our Fellowship requires the preservation of this principle."(page 150 *Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions*)

"Each day, somewhere in the world, recovery begins when one alcoholic talks with another alcoholic, sharing experience, strength, and hope."(page XXII *Alcoholics Anonymous Fourth Edition*)

"Alcoholics Anonymous is a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength, and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others recover from alcoholism...Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics achieve sobriety."(from the A.A. Preamble)

"Our membership ought to include all who suffer from alcoholism. Hence we may refuse none who wish to recover. Nor ought A.A. membership ever depend upon money or conformity. Any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an A.A. group, provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation."(page 563 *Alcoholics Anonymous Fourth Edition*)

How can we best help the alcoholic who needs and wants our help? Isn't it by closely following the principles that our founders laid out for us? We would ask that, for the benefit of all A.A. groups in our area, the individual groups have a look at The A.A. Group and Problems Other Than Alcohol pamphlets as well as the traditions and other writings and have this discussion with their group members. The result may well be a more useful A.A. in our area.

A Note From the H & I Chair

Greetings to all

My name is Ken and I am an alcoholic. I again come to you with humbleness and gratitude for the opportunity to serve district 6 as your H&I chair. I have and continue to be blessed as a direct result. I want to publicly thank all the liaisons currently serving this district and the volunteers. The message of recovery continues to be carried to those within the various hospitals and institutions within our district. We are still in need of a liaison for the 3B facility. It saddens me to know that we are having dark nights within this facility and that the message of recovery is not being carried to these kids. They did not get to where they are at for eating too many jelly beans and the cross roads that they are standing at could very well mean the difference between a happy healthy life or a life of misery, and ultimately the difference between life and death. If you have the desire to make a difference and you have a minimum of 2 years of sobriety and can pass a back ground check then you would be eligible. If you would like to discuss this further please feel free to contact me at 757-0803.

Jami M. is making great progress on the bridge the gap program for the district. The work she is doing is both solid and thorough. This program should be on line soon. If you have questions about this program or would like to be of service within it please contact Jami M. your bridge the gap liaison.

We have recently been presented with another possible institution that is in need of the message of

recovery. The Ruth House is a halfway house for women coming out of other institutions. A large percentage of these women have substance abuse issues and are in need of recovery. I will be meeting with the staff of Ruth House within the next couple of weeks to discuss Alcoholics Anonymous and H&I. We will be looking for a female liaison for this new venture so if this would interest you please feel free to give me a call so we can discuss the possibilities.

Unfortunately we are also in need of a liaison for the women's jail as well. Jami M. has volunteered to carry the meetings into the facility until such time that we can fill the vacant position. It saddens me that this facility has also had dark nights. I was unaware the meetings were not being held until recently. I would like to apologies to the district for not being more on top of the situation.

Finally I would like to announce that on Saturday September 20th from 12 noon till 4 pm H&I and PICPC will be sponsoring a work shop for those interested in service within H&I to include the bridge the gap program. You will find a flier announcing this event further on in the news letter.

I again thank you all for the opportunity to serve Alcoholics Anonymous.

Step 8 / Tradition 8 / Concept VIII

Step 8 - Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.

“Now we need more action, without which we find that ‘Faith without works is dead’... Our real purpose is to fit ourselves to be of maximum service to God and the people about us.”

“As I faced the Eight Step, everything that was required for successful completion of the previous seven Steps came together: courage, honesty, sincerity, willingness and thoroughness... I needed the courage to begin, the honesty to see where I was wrong, a sincere desire to set things right, thoroughness in making a list, and willingness to take the risks required for true humility.”

Daily Reflections, page 234

“Steps Eight and Nine are concerned with personal relations. First, we take a look backward and try to discover where we have been at fault; next we make a vigorous attempt to repair the damage we have done; and third, having thus cleaned away the debris of the past, we consider how...we may develop the best possible relations with every human being we know. “Learning how to live in the greatest peace, partnership, and brotherhood with all men and women, of whatever description, is a moving and fascinating adventure.”

“We clung to the claim that when drinking we never hurt anybody but ourselves. Our families didn’t suffer, because we always paid the bills and seldom drank at home. Our business associates didn’t suffer, because we were usually on the job. Our reputations hadn’t suffered, because we were certain few knew of our dinking... “This attitude, of course, is the end result of purposeful forgetting. It is an attitude which can only be changed by a deep and honest search of our motives and actions.”

Tradition 8 - Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.

The Long Form

Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional. We define professionalism as the occupation of counseling alcoholics for fees or hire. But we may employ alcoholics where they

are going to perform those services for which we might otherwise have to engage nonalcoholics. Such special services may be well recompensed. But our usual A.A. “12 Step” work is never to be paid for.

Concept VIII - The trustees are the principal planners and administrators of overall policy and finance. They have custodial oversight of the separately incorporated and constantly active services, exercising this through their ability to elect all the directors of these entities.

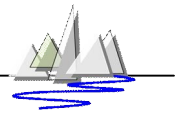

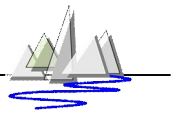
